

## Overview

Since 1996, the Adani Foundation, social welfare and development arm of the Adani Group, has remained agile and deeply committed to making strategic social investments for sustainable outcomes across India. It is empowering and enriching the lives of children, women, youth, and marginalized communities in the core areas of education, health and nutrition, sustainable livelihoods, climate action, and community development. The strategies of the Foundation are integrated in national priorities and global Sustainable Development Goals. The Adani Foundation is currently operating in 6,769 villages across 19 states, positively impacting 9.1 million lives.

## Building Strong Ties with The Communities

AWL Agri Business Limited (formerly known as Adani Wilmar Limited) is implementing its CSR initiatives through the Adani Foundation. The Adani Foundation is transforming communities through innovative programmes focused on inclusive and sustainable development. We prioritize empowering women by promoting self-reliance and entrepreneurship. Our initiatives align with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs) and aim to facilitate the overall socio-economic progress of underserved populations.

## CSR Initiatives in FY 2024-25

AWL Agri Business Limited (formerly known as Adani Wilmar Limited) has spent Rs. 12 crore towards CSR activities in FY 2024-25 through the Adani Foundation. It has been utilized for:

### Health & Nutrition:

India is experiencing a significant rise in non-communicable diseases such as diabetes, heart disease, and cancer that are a leading cause of mortality. Further, maternal and child mortality rates remain grim in rural areas. With a vision to foster an equitable society where everyone, across all age groups, can lead a healthy and productive life.

The Adani Foundation focuses on both preventive and curative healthcare solutions. Our commitment to improving the health and nutrition status of the neediest sections of society has taken the shape of several projects. This includes mobile healthcare units and health camps for primary care, rural clinics and hospitals for secondary and tertiary care, and project SuPoshan to combat malnutrition and anemia by empowering village-level volunteers as SuPoshan Sanginis.

## Adani Chikitsalayam Provides Essential Healthcare Services to Displaced Families in Krishnapattnam, Andhra Pradesh

A comprehensive approach to improving health will necessitate ensuring universal access to healthcare, as well as making medicine and vaccines affordable. Basic health facilities are provided to the displaced families of Adani Krishnapattanam Port through

Adani Chikitsalayam, located in the Rehabilitation and Resettlement Colony in Muthukur, SPSR Nellore District, Andhra Pradesh. Medical health services including diagnosis, treatment, and provision of medicines are offered to 750 fishermen community families in the R&R Colony, Muthukur, for their ailments on all working days during daytime, free of charge. Adani Chikitsalayam is staffed with a doctor, pharmacist, nursing personnel, and aides. This year, 9,865 basic health ailment cases were diagnosed and received treatment at Adani Chikitsalayam, creating a healthier environment and reducing the rate of non-communicable diseases. The average number of patients per day ranges from 35 to 45.

### **Health Camps and Fog Operations in Krishnapattanam**

Mobile health services are provided to community families in eight villages on a biweekly basis, with one visit per village resulting in 16 camps per month. Each camp receives between 40 to 60 patients, and a total of 3,878 patients with basic ailments have been tested, diagnosed, and prescribed appropriate medicines for prompt recovery. Additionally, our medical team conducts follow-up health management reviews.

Our team maintains close coordination with local government medical authorities, jointly conducting general health checkup camps to address basic ailments. Adani Foundation's primary objective is to deliver healthcare management services to community families at their doorstep, enhancing its brand image in rural villages.

**Fog Operations** - Many community villages and areas within Port premises experience water logging, which poses a risk of mosquito-borne diseases such as Malaria, Filariasis, and Dengue. To address these health concerns, fogging operations are conducted in these regions to control the mosquito population. These operations benefit 12,500 families by helping to reduce the incidence of mosquito-borne diseases, contributing to better health outcomes.

### **Fortune SuPoshan (FY 2024-25)**

Project Fortune SuPoshan, managed by Adani Foundation, aims to curb malnutrition and improve the nutritional status and overall health of children under five. The project also includes adolescent girls, and pregnant and lactating mothers across its operational areas. The program is delivered by community-based volunteers known as SuPoshan Sanginis, who play a significant role in grassroots implementation.

550 Sanginis participated in the project across 16 sites. Sanginis function as key community volunteers, conducting field-level activities, providing counseling, screenings, generating awareness, and performing follow-ups.

## Key Highlights of the Year 2024–25

### a. Community Engagement & Counseling:

- Conducted family counseling sessions with 79,474 women on nutrition, hygiene, and health.
- Held 33,402 focused group discussions with mothers of malnourished children and their families on health and nutrition issues.

### b. Child Health & Nutrition Screening

Quarterly screenings conducted by Sanginis assessed the health of 82,000 children under 5 years of age. Among these, 12,606 children were identified as experiencing wasting (malnourishment). These children received targeted home visits and nutritional care provided by Sanginis. The project also guaranteed access to Take-Home Rations (THR) from Anganwadi Centres and supported home-based nutrition interventions.

### c. Referrals and Rehabilitation

164 Severely Acute Malnourished (SAM) children were referred to Nutrition Rehabilitation Centres (NRCs). Following discharge from NRCs, 146 children received WASH kits to support and reinforce hygiene practices.

### d. Nutrition Security Initiatives

7,245 cooking demonstrations have been conducted across various communities. 2,000 kitchen gardens have been developed to enhance household-level nutrition. 826 families have been provided with seed kits to support the development of kitchen gardens.

### e. Visible Impact

4,000 children transitioned from malnourished to healthy status because of targeted project interventions.

## Celebrations and Community Campaigns

This year, the SuPoshan team celebrated the 7th Poshan Maah, with 1,21,795 participants joining in 895 Poshan Rallies, 7069 Poshan Salah events, 3386 Poshan Samvad talks, 1358 Poshan Melas, 1534 Poshan Yukt Aahar Pradarshans, and 1324 Poshan Vatika activities across 16 locations.

## Special Observance Days:

These events aimed to raise community awareness about hygiene, sanitation, and maternal and child health. The following days were observed:

- Global Handwashing Day
- World Toilet Day
- Mother's Day
- Breastfeeding Week

### **Support to Government Initiatives in Madhya Pradesh and Andhra Pradesh**

Approximately 500 tuberculosis (TB) patients were provided with Nutri kits under the Government of India's Nikshay Mitra program at the Vidisha and Neemuch sites in Madhya Pradesh. Following a special request from the district collector, we have supported and adopted TB patients by providing them with Nutri kits that include cereals, pulses, and protein-rich dry supplements.

In collaboration with the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Department, we supplied caps and T-shirts to promote Poshan Utsav, an awareness campaign led by the Department of Women and Child Development in Gujarat.

We installed one RO water purifier at the District Nutrition Rehabilitation Center in Neemuch. This initiative aims to assist both caretakers and children who reside at the NRC center for 14 days.

Responding to a special request from the NRC center in Kakinada, the project also supported them with toys and educational materials.

### **Project Fortune SuPoshan Transition**

Project Fortune SuPoshan concluded its operations in Varanasi (Uttar Pradesh) and Raipur (Chhattisgarh) on 31st March 2025, following the completion of the phaseout cycle. A third-party evaluation of the project's impact has been conducted, and the results are pending.

Additionally, a baseline survey was conducted at five new Project Fortune SuPoshan sites by an external agency. The new sites are:

- Kakinada (Andhra Pradesh)
- Umarpada (Gujarat)
- Wardhman (West Bengal)
- Vidisha (Madhya Pradesh)
- Saoner (Maharashtra)

### **Awards and Recognition**

Project Fortune SuPoshan was honored with the Doing Good for Bharat Awards 2024 by CSRBOX in the category of Philanthropy for Impact - Doing Good for People at the

India CSR & ESG Summit in New Delhi. The award was presented by the Union Minister of Government of India.

Project Fortune SuPoshan continues to achieve remarkable progress in combating malnutrition and enhancing health indicators through community-driven initiatives. The partnership between Adani Foundation and Adani Wilmar has been pivotal in delivering impactful results at the grassroots level and providing institutional support.

- The program addresses both nutritional needs and the strengthening of community systems by closely collaborating with government institutions, such as Anganwadi Centres and Nutritional Rehabilitation Centres (NRCs).

## Education

The Adani Foundation aims to transform lives through education, especially for marginalized communities. It builds institutions like Adani Vidya Mandir (Four – Ahmedabad & Bhadrashwar in Gujarat; Surguja in Chhattisgarh; Krishnapattanam in Andhra Pradesh) and Adani Schools (37 Schools managed by the Adani Foundation) and runs initiatives such as Project Utthan (in 316 schools covering 50000+ students) and Udaan (Over 5,00,000 students benefitted till date), providing inclusive and affordable learning opportunities.

In addition to operating cost-free and subsidized schools across India, the Foundation runs initiatives such as Project Utthan to enhance learning outcomes in government schools. It also supports digital tools and classrooms at the grassroots level, offering free coaching, evening classes, and scholarships.

Project Udaan aims to inspire youth by organizing exposure tours to Adani Group's business sites, giving students firsthand insights into large-scale operations.

### Adani Vidya Mandir – Krishnapattanam:

Adani Vidya Mandir, Krishnapattanam (AVMK) provides free education, study materials, uniforms, meals, and transportation facilities in a quiet, green environment with skilled faculty and learning-focused infrastructure. The school encourages sports and athletics among students, supporting their participation in district and zonal level sports events. AVMK's vision is to offer free and quality education to meritorious students from socially and economically disadvantaged fishing communities.

AVMK at the R & R Colony in Muthukur Village is an English Medium School offering classes from Play Class to 10th Class, following the State Government curriculum. It is managed by the Adani Foundation. The school emphasizes value-based education. There are a total of 1011 students enrolled, with 48.7% being girls. Of these, 968 students come from socially and economically disadvantaged fishing community families.

## **Support to Cyclone Affected People in Andhra Pradesh**

The Adani Group donated Rs 25 crore to support flood relief efforts in Andhra Pradesh. Several parts of the states were hit by floods in the month of September 2024 due to incessant rains and subsequent overflowing of tanks and rivers. Heavy rain and floods claimed 46 lives and caused extensive property losses in the affected districts. More than 6.44 lakh people have been affected due to the floods, which also damaged crops over 2.14 lakh hectares.

Karan Adani, the CEO of Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone Limited, handed over the cheque of Rs 25 crore to Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu.

"Deeply troubled by the extensive damage caused by the recent torrential rains and flooding in Andhra Pradesh. The Adani Group stands in solidarity with the people of Andhra Pradesh and humbly extend our support through the Adani Foundation with a contribution of Rs 25 crore to the relief effort," Adani Group Chairman Gautam Adani said in his social media post.

Apart from the above, the Company has contributed Rs. 1.77 crore directly across its manufacturing sites in various areas such as providing educational facilities, employment and enhancing vocational skills among women, ensuring environmental sustainability and conservation of natural resources.
